In this seminar you will learn the steps of the foreclosure process. Florida Statute 45.031 outlines the procedures to be followed in any sale of real or personal property under an order or judgment by court. There will be a review of the law and the requirements of the final judgment, publication of sale, and conduct of the sale, including the deposit schedule and documents required. In addition to explaining the foreclosure process, the role and responsibilities of the Clerk will be discussed.

Filing a Small Claim is way to settle a legal dispute with someone when the damages or value of property involved does not exceed \$5,000.00. Small Claims court is called the "people's court" and a lawyer is not required. This seminar will focus on the basic requirements for filing a Small Claim in Collier County as well as the specific process steps. There will be an overview of the various forms and fees associated with the small claims process as well as the challenges in resolving a judgment.
